

**Announcement of the call for applications for participation in program
No. 7/2024 of May 7, 2024.**

The Director of the Polish National Agency for Academic Exchange, acting pursuant to Art. 19 section 1 of the Act of July 7, 2017 on the Polish National Agency for Academic Exchange (consolidated text: Journal of Laws of 2023, item 843), announces the call for applications for participation in the program entitled KATAMARAN – Creation and implementation of international study programmes – Call 2024.

<p>I. Aim and deadline for the implementation of the Program and the implementation period of the Project</p>	<p>1. The aim of the Program is to develop the internationalization of higher education and science institutions by supporting the creation and implementation of international study programs</p> <p>Internationalization of higher education and science contributes to improving the quality of education by including in the education process the opportunity to gain international experience, take classes or internships in a different environment and learn about cultural and linguistic diversity.</p> <p>The main factor in the internationalization of universities is the implementation of international education programs leading to the “issuing joint, double or multiple diplomas”.</p> <p>The programs are a big challenge- they require agreements between foreign partners in many areas (core curriculum, requirements and regulations in force in a given country, involvement of competent teaching and research staff, finding candidates for studies conducted in a foreign language- open to completing part of the studies outside the country). The substantive effort and organizational potential engaged by partner universities in the implementation of international study programs give them the status of elite and good quality. As a consequence, developing international programs with foreign partners and their implementation increases the attractiveness of Polish universities and institutes among students, PhD students and academic staff both from Poland and abroad.</p> <p>The KATAMARAN program enables the following for universities:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) creating joint study programs: a joint study program is an advanced form of cooperation in which universities jointly define a new qualification/new study program; the study program is fully co-implemented by the partners and is based on jointly developed components regarding specific learning outcomes, program content, names of subjects, call rules, etc.; a joint study program ends with the award of a joint diploma; 2) creating double study programs that use the formula of building the so-called double diplomas (in the existing study program offers, two universities look for common elements that may constitute the basis for meeting the standard of a given qualification assigned to both the study program of one and the other university); 3) creating, on principles analogous to double study programs, multiple study programs with multiple partners, ending with the issuance of multiple diplomas; 4) creating two (or more) study programs that end with the issuance of a joint diploma; 5) implementing joint study programs ending with the award of a joint diploma; 6) implementing double or multiple study programs, with two or more
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	<p>partners, ending with the issuance of double or multiple diplomas;</p> <p>7) implementing two (or more) study programs that end with the issuance of a joint diploma.</p> <p>Based on the above, two support paths have been identified for institutions that want to apply for funding for projects in the call for offers:</p> <p>1) path A – Creating international first- or second-cycle study programs or uniform master's studies, giving the possibility of issuing a joint, double or multiple diploma or</p> <p>2) path B – Implementing the existing international first- or second-cycle study programs, ending with the issuance of a joint, double or multiple diploma.</p>

The international partner (or Partners) is not entitled to incur expenses under the Applicant's project.
