	Increasing international mobility of researchers in Poland: How to create favourable conditions for developing an international research career?
	Poland needs increased influx of international researchers and doctoral candidates, and attracting talent in this field is key to further develop research and innovation. Even though we have succeeded in attracting international students, especially from Central and Eastern Europe and Asia, the mobility of researchers and PhD students remains a challenge. What factors besides engaging in EURAXESS will facilitate scientific collaboration at international level. What does an attractive international research environment which takes care of work and life wellbeing mean? Finding a balance between research support, social integration and favourable living conditions in Poland is essential for talent attraction.
